Reconciliation

This is the mystery of our faith: Liturgist:

All: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again!

We proclaim Christ as King, yet the way we live often proclaims our lack of faith in Liturgist:

his power to deal with the world. Let us confess the incongruity between our faith

and practice:

All: We confess to you, Lord, our lack of trust. While we sing of your lordship over

> all creation, we have too often acted as though you are powerless in the face of today's events. Help us to live with confidence in your presence today and in

hope for life with you forever.

Silent Confession and Reflection

Liturgist: May the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the glorious Father, give you the Spirit of

wisdom and revelation so that you may know him better.

All: May the eyes of our hearts be enlightened in order that we may know the hope

to which we were called, the riches of his glorious inheritance in his people,

and his incomparably great power for us who believe.

That power is the same as the mighty strength he exerted when he raised Christ Liturgist:

from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly realms –

far above all rule and authority, all power and dominion, and every name that All:

can be invoked, not only in this present age but also in the one to come.

And God placed all things under his feet and appointed him head over Liturgist:

everything for the church, which is his body, the fullness of him who fills

everything in every way. Ephesians 1:15-23 adapted
